Rosanna Karabetsos, a Hartford, CT native, began her dance career at the Greater Hartford Academy of the Arts. As a lead puppeteer and choreographer for Nightfall Hartford, she discovered a passion for community through the arts. Rosanna choreographed for competitive dance teams, danced with DFX Entertainment, and contributed to Mohegan Sun Arena. Relocating to New York City, she joined the NBA Brooklynettes dance team. Dedicated to her hometown, Rosanna hosts events like the Small State Great Beer festival and contributes to "The Parkville Sessions." She's the Vice President of the Hartford Dance Collective, Co-Director of the Dance Company at the Fashion Institute of Technology, and has collaborated with artists like BLACKPINK and Lil Kim. Represented by United Talent Agency, Rosanna's choreography credits include institutions like Alabama State University.



Elliott Keller (he/him), originally from Rochester, NY, is a Brooklyn-based educator and movement artist currently teaching Jazz and Contemporary dance at Wagner College on Staten Island. Holding a Master of Fine Arts in Modern Dance from The University of Utah, Elliott is an advocate for inclusive and empowering classrooms. Alongside collaborator Mar Undag, he is actively involved in various choreographic projects. With a background that includes performing with the Zodiaque Dance Company and Melanie Aceto Contemporary Dance Company at Jacob's Pillow, Elliott has also worked with renowned dance companies like Limón Dance, Paul Taylor Dance, Parsons Dance, and the Joffrey Ballet School. His performance experience extends from commercial settings with Celebrity Cruises to concert stages with Project 44, Sans Limites Dance, and Salt Contemporary Dance in Salt Lake City, UT.



Michelle Moreno, a native of Caracas, Venezuela, embarked on her ballet journey at Ballet Keyla Ermecheo, graduating under the guidance of Rafael Portillo, Vladimir Lopukhov, and Roumen Rachev. Progressing from corps de ballet to coryphée, she secured a contract with Ballet Metropolitano de Caracas and later joined Ballet Juvenil Teatro Teresa Carreno, performing in classical and neoclassical works such as Don Quixote and Swan Lake. Michele returned to Ballet Metropolitano as a soloist, touring internationally before relocating to New York to train with Natalya Stavro. Currently, she contributes her talents to Contemporary Ballet Theater and Staten Island Ballet, also serving as faculty. Michele's international impact includes guest appearances in Ibiza, Spain, and she holds certifications from the Bolshoi Ballet Academy. As a dedicated educator, she teaches at Broadway Dance Center and has been a faculty member since 2017, specializing in advanced teens and pointe classes.

Ginger Cox, a distinguished dance educator and choreographer, currently holds faculty positions at Pace University and the Joffrey Ballet Contemporary Jazz Program, showcasing her expertise globally. With a Master's in Kinesiology from ATSU and a BFA in Dance from Temple University, Ginger's impactful teaching style earned her a feature in Dance Train Magazine. Renowned for her dynamic choreography, she has collaborated with Nike, the NJ Nets Dancers, recording artist Lijie, and more. Serving as the Artistic Director of LiNK! the movement dance company, Ginger, alongside Derek Mitchell, innovatively co-created the Choreographer's Workshop at BDC, offering dancers a unique platform to create and showcase their work in a single weekend. Actively involved in the dance community, Ginger serves on advisory boards for the Young Choreographers Dance Festival and Broadway Dance Center's Faculty Advisory Board. Her remarkable performance resume includes appearances on Saturday Night Live, Radio City Music Hall, and collaborations with diverse artists in various dance concerts.



Lu Cuadra is An award winning choreographer and performer has toured both regionally and nationally with several production companies. He has choreographed and performed with various emerging artists, college dance teams, touring hip hop companies, and numerous competition teams. His teaching style fuses street hip hop with jazz technique, pop and lock, and club styled movement. A Californian native now rooted in Brooklyn, NY; Lu combines a little west coast thrash with northeast flash.
